What is a Trash-Free Lunch? Only food and drinks and reusable containers, napkins and utensils. Why? See the other side of this flyer!

Exciting Changes to our Super Sorting Program!

Throughout the year **students who sign up to be “Super Sorters” and help their classmates sort their waste for THREE weeks per semester will receive a \$5 Manhattan Beach Creamery gift card!** Student must sign in with the lunchtime aides at the beginning of the week and complete the entire week of super sorting. At the end of the semester, the weeks will be tallied and the prizes given!

Why do this? Here are some facts to inspire you:

- ✓ **The City of Manhattan Beach has become the first city in Southern California to launch a full-scale Food Waste Recycling Program that turns food leftovers into renewable, clean, green energy!**
- ✓ The goal of the program is to increase diversion levels and reduce the amount of waste that is taken to the landfills since **approximately 25% of waste generated comes from food waste.**
- ✓ Currently, Waste Management's CORE® produced engineered bio-slurry (EBS) is being used by the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County at their Joint Water Pollution Control Plant in Carson, CA, where it is added to the plant's anaerobic digestion system to increase the production of biogas (methane). **The project converts food waste into renewable biogas each day, which is used to generate electricity.**
- ✓ Every ton of food waste we recycle through the CORE process is **equivalent to eliminating CO2 emissions from 30 cars on our Southern California roads.**
- ✓ As one of the **most innovative food waste recycling solutions, the CORE® provides an avenue to meet California's 2020 goal of 75% landfill diversion** (AB341) and the State's organics waste recycling mandates (AB1826). The CORE® enables Waste Management to provide its customers with a cost-effective alternative for diverting food waste from disposal and to participate in a new and exciting sustainable technology.

Every Day Is Trash-Free Lunch Day at Grand View!

As a U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon School, Grand View encourages parents and students to pack a trash-free lunch EVERY day. And if you can't be trash free, Grand View asks you to sort your waste into recycling, food and landfill waste.

During the month of October, the **Grand View student who brings the most trash-free lunches will win dinner for four at Rock & Brews!** (*El Segundo location; value \$100.*)

Why do this? Here are some facts to inspire you:

- ✓ **Most of what we eat, drink, or use in any way comes packaged in petroleum plastic—a material designed to last forever, yet used for products that we then throw away.** Today, our landfills and beaches are awash in plastic packaging, and expendable products that have no value at the end of their short lifecycle.
- ✓ **Lots of plastic is getting into the oceans' food chains/webs.** Most plastic floats near the sea surface where some is mistaken for food by birds and fish. Research shows that there are now 6 pounds of plastic pieces in the ocean for every pound of zooplankton, a basic food for most sea animals.
- ✓ **The U.S. discards more than 250 million tons of trash each year, or about 4.5 pounds per person each day.** Most of that waste is either recyclable or compostable, but just one-third is actually recycled.
- ✓ **In Los Angeles County we generate enough trash to fill Dodger Stadium every few DAYS. Packing a trash-free lunch helps our environment, and saves money for both Grand View and Grand View parents.** Since starting the Trash Free Lunch program 7 years ago, Grand View has saved nearly \$5,000 each year. That money that is now going to buy things our teachers need instead of trash-hauler pick-ups and garbage bags. Parents save money, too—up to \$300 a year per child—when they use reusable containers.
